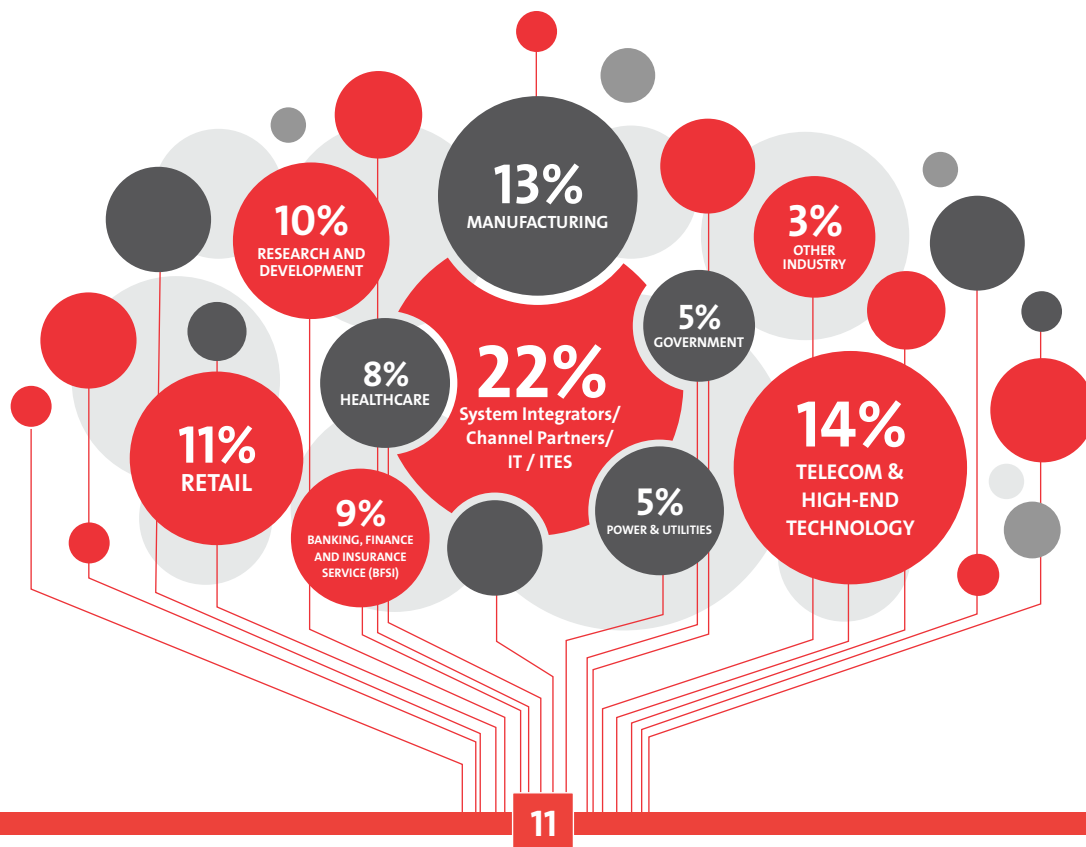
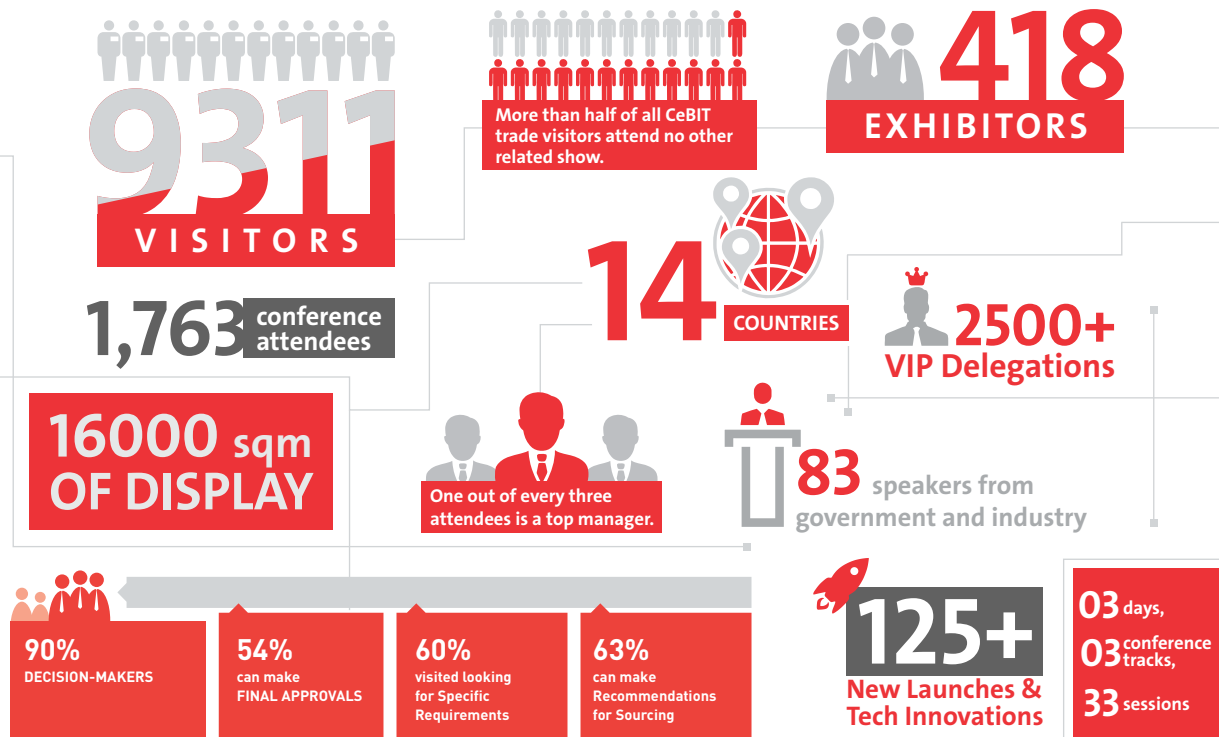

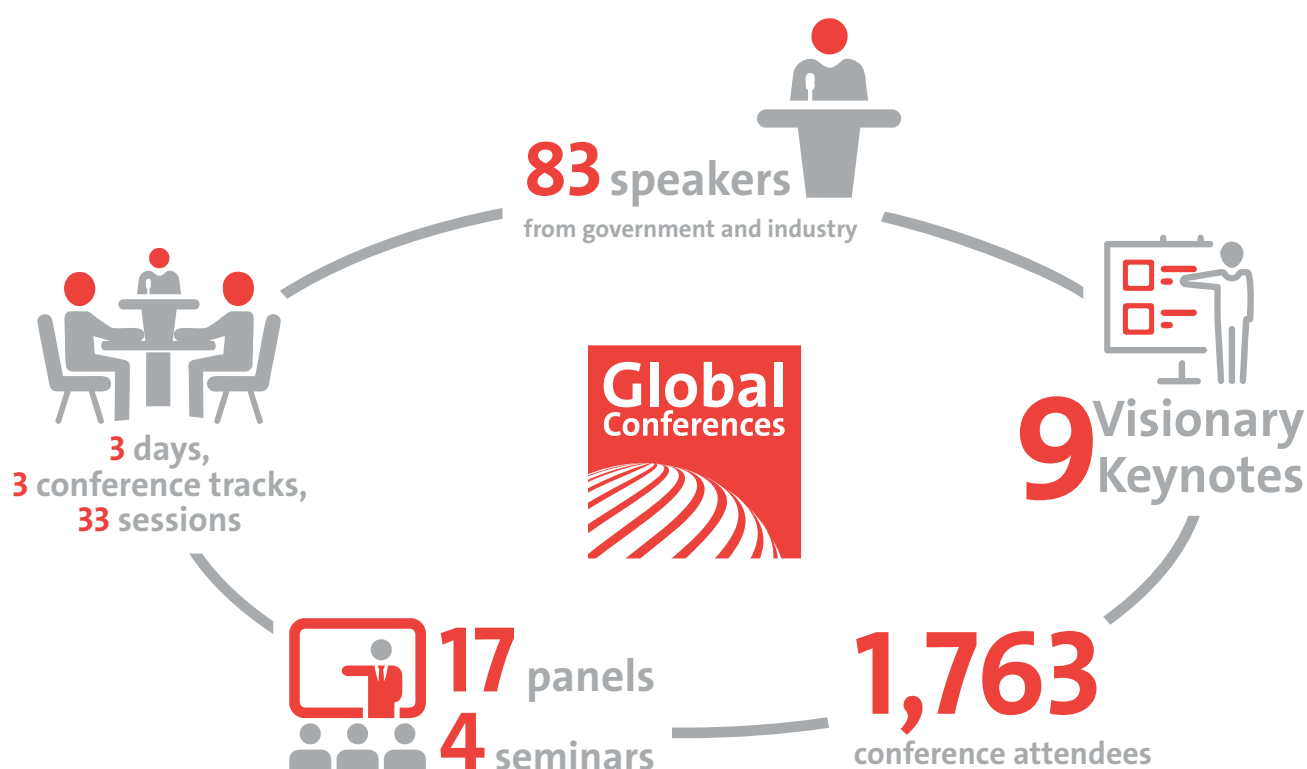
Confluence of visionaries, thought leaders and technology pundits

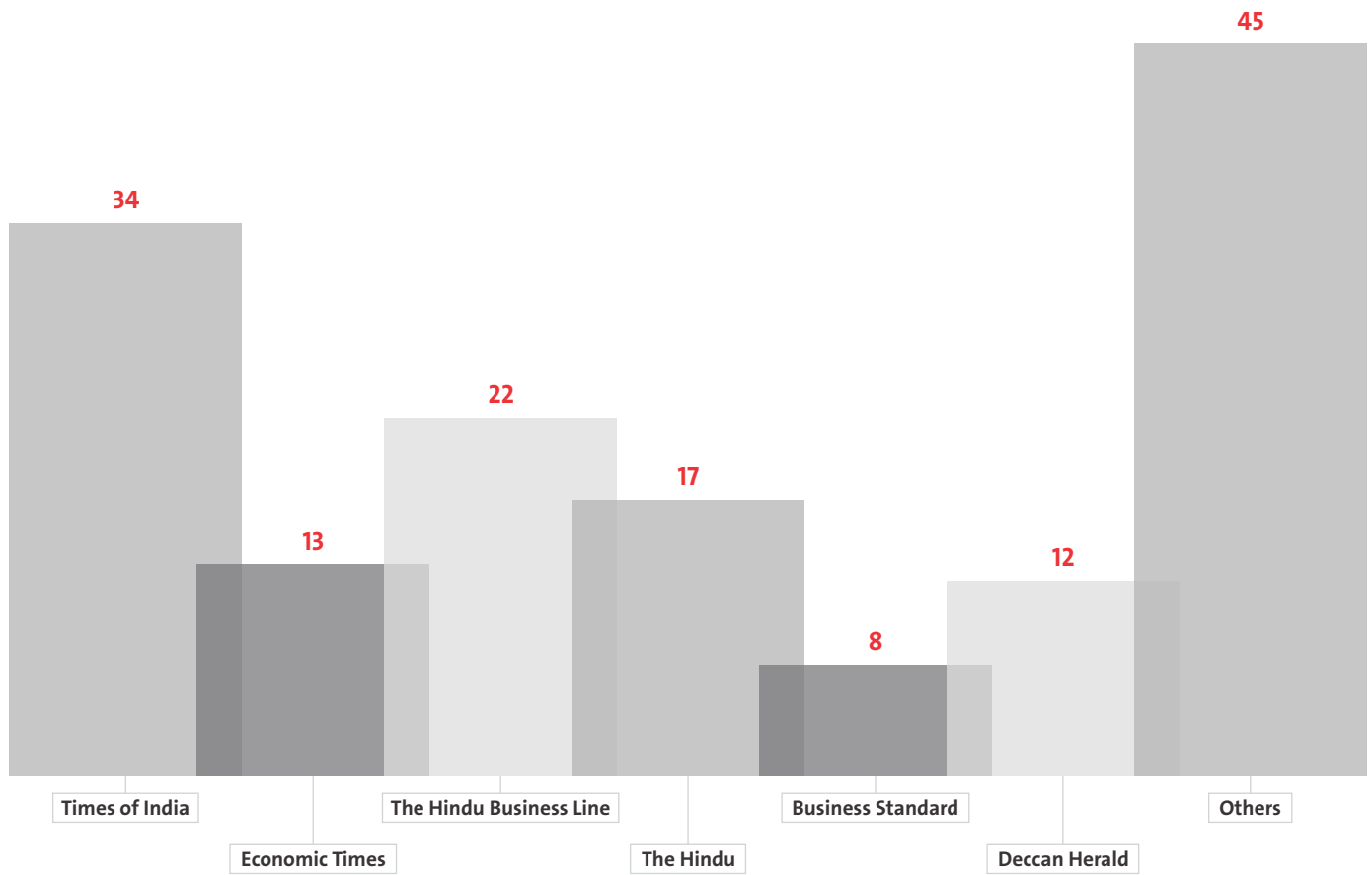

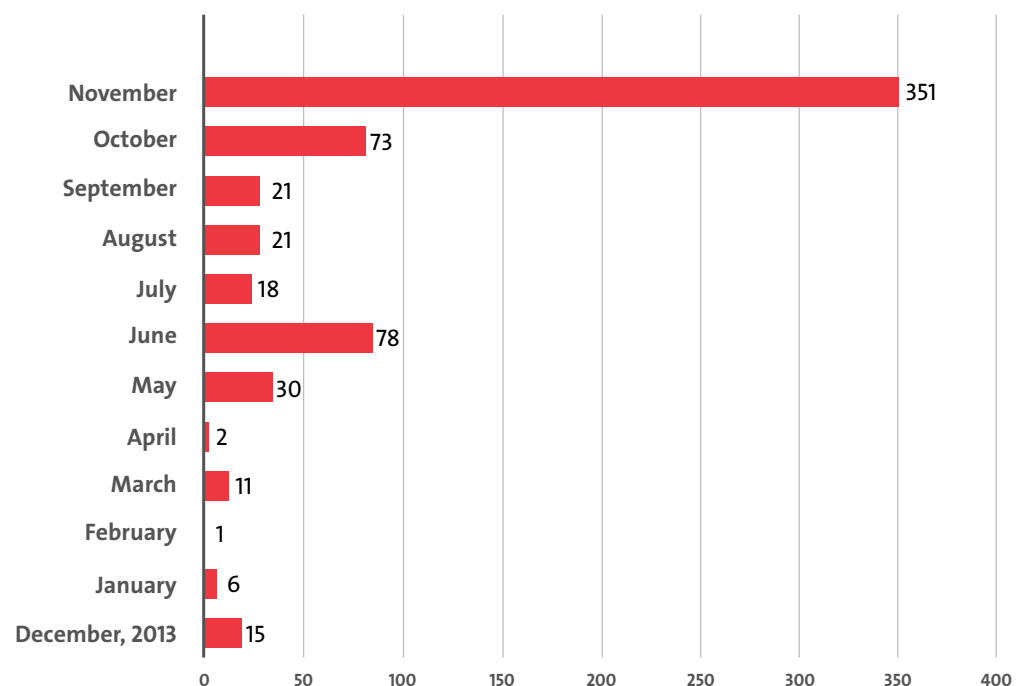

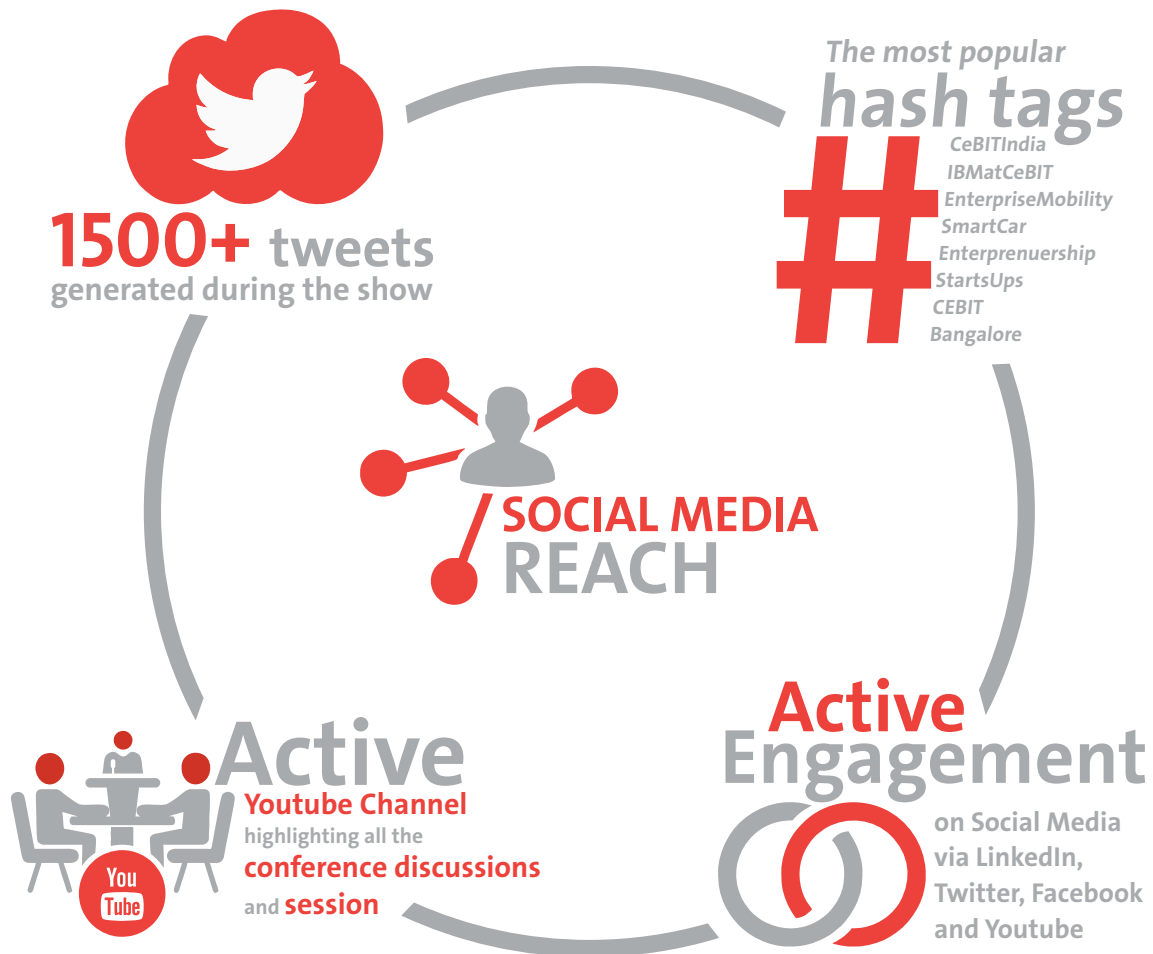
